# HOW TO GET TO CHIANG MAI UNIVERSITY (CMU), EXPLORE PLACES AROUND CHIANG MAI OLD CITY, AND REACH THE MEETING HOTEL

You can reach the CMU, meeting hotel and the old city center by a local red taxi or taxi service using the Grab car application.



If you are unfamiliar with the Grab car application, there is also a taxi service that could take you directly from the airport to your hotel, which is available at the international arrival gate.

# GRAB CAR/ TAXI FROM AIRPORT



Proceed to Exit Door 1 for the Grab and Airport Taxi Pickup Point

Service Price: 150-250 Thai Baht (4 – 8 EUR) to city or downtown

For travelers with large luggage, it is recommended to use an airport taxi, as it offers greater comfort and flexibility. The fares are reasonable and fair, and passengers have the option to request a receipt for the fare.

#### **USEFUL INFORMATION IN THAILAND**

#### SIM CARDS

There are several telecommunication companies from which you can purchase a local SIM card (normal sims or net sims). These companies include AIS, True Move, and DTAC. You can buy a SIM card at the airport arrival gate or general convenience stores in Thailand.



### TIME

Thailand is GMT+7 and does not operate on a daylight-savings system (therefore GMT+6 in summertime).

#### WEATHER

The weather in Thailand is warm and sunny year-round, with an average temperature range from 28°C to 35 °C. We highly recommend you bring sun protection; wearing sunscreen and a hat are the best ways to avoid heatstroke and sunburn.

In January, Chiang Mai offers pleasant weather with warm days (27–30°C) and cool nights (13–17°C), but air pollution from early burning season can cause hazy skies, especially later in the month. Visitors are advised to monitor air quality using reliable apps like *AirVisual* or *Air4Thai* and take precautions if PM2.5 levels rise





### ELECTRICITY

Power outlets usually feature two-prong round or flat sockets. It is recommended to bring a universal plug adaptor.



In Thailand, power plugs and sockets (outlets) of type A, type B, type C, type F and type O are used. The standard voltage is 220 V at a frequency of 50 Hz.

#### FINANCIAL

Thailand's official currency is the Thai baht, pronounced "baaht" and has the international currency code THB. 100 satang is equal to one baht. You may find change in supermarkets in coins with values of 1, 2, 5, and 10 baht and 25 and 50 satang. There are five denominations of banknotes, 20, 50, 100, 500, and 1000 baht.



### Additional advice

Using banknotes in denominations of 20 to 500 baht is more convenient for shopping, as smaller shops may refuse to accept 1,000 baht notes due to limited change availability.





### TRANSPORTATION

A typical city trip, based on distance or a mutual agreement, usually costs between 30 and 100 baht. Travelers can often communicate with the driver in English. However, it is not recommended to use such vehicles, as the driver may charge a fixed fare, which could be unreasonably high.

#### **Recommend Dishes**

### Pad Thai

is a popular Thai stir-fried dish made with rice noodles, eggs, tofu, and either shrimp or chicken, seasoned with tamarind paste, fish sauce, palm sugar, and chili flakes. It is usually served with crushed peanuts, pickled radish, fresh vegetables like bean sprouts, pennywort leaves, and lime for added tanginess. The dish offers a perfect balance of sour, sweet, salty, and spicy flavors.



# • Khao soi

is a traditional food from northern Thailand. It is similar to noodle soup, served in a spicy broth with curry paste. The side dishes include pickled mustard greens, shallots, and condiments like chili oil, lime juice, fish sauce, and sugar.



## Tom Yum Goong

is a famous Thai dish, a spicy and sour shrimp soup flavored with herbs like lemongrass, kaffir lime leaves, galangal, chilies, and lime. It can be made with a clear broth or with added milk or coconut milk for a creamier texture. It's known for its bold and aromatic flavors, often including mushrooms and other vegetables.



# Mango sticky rice

is a popular dessert in Southeast and South Asia, especially in Thailand. It consists of glutinous rice soaked in sweet coconut milk, served with ripe, juicy mangoes, typically of the Nam Dok Mai variety. The sticky rice is soft and pairs perfectly with the refreshing sweetness of the mango. Sometimes, it's topped with crispy mung beans or shredded coconut for added texture and flavor.
